ACTS 20:17-38 PAUL'S FAREWELL TO THE EPHESIAN ELDERS

Of all the speeches that Luke records in <u>Acts</u>, this is the only one delivered to Christians only. Paul's passion for a thorough ministry and his personal example of fidelity to God's truth underscores the message. Paul's main objective: to encourage similar fidelity in the Ephesian elders (and in us). Encouragement, warning, exhortation are paramount. Remember: Luke was an eyewitness to this event.

20:17-21 Paul's Personal Example of Fidelity in Ministry

v. 17	"he called the ELDERS* of the church" (at Ephesus)
	*ELDERS = $\pi\rho\epsilon\sigma\beta$ υτερος / presbuteros = one of New Testament words for pastorteachers. This word calls attention to their maturity in Christ.
	 ELDERS in v. 28 are called (επισκοπος / episkopos). This word calls attention to their; they watch closely the flock of God. v. 28 also speaks of their primary function: "to shepherd (KJV, "feed") the flock of God."
	" <u>Elder</u> " <u>Summary</u> : <u>Elders</u> are relatively mature men who are appointed by the Holy Spirit as <u>overseers</u> of the local church primarily for the purpose of <u>shepherding</u> God's flock.
v. 18-21	Paul's Consistency: from day, YOU know my fidelity of service to Jesus Christ including:
